**** IMPORTANT NOTICE ****

Recently, there were two separate incidents on Ridgebrook. In both incidents, residents were home, and lights were on. However, doors and/or windows were unlocked or open. A purse was stolen from one home and the Sheriff's Office was called out. Unfortunately, the Sheriff found no evidence in the home.

In a separate incident a resident went outside in the evening, leaving the door unlocked. A while later, noises were heard from inside the house. When the resident got up to investigate, voices were heard saying something similar to "Let's get out of here".

The resident did not find the source of these voices but assumed there were trespassers who fled.

Each of these incidents validates the importance of constantly being aware of what's happening in our own "backyards". JT6 is still a very safe place to live, however we should keep our eyes and ears open and use good judgment in order to keep our families and property safe.
